After a few minutes of the intense pain in the abdominal area she felt strong pressure around her pelvic area and that was when she had seen a little bit of blood, and then what appeared to be a sack/placenta with a baby inside. The baby was not moving as it hit the floor [redacted] said that she only sat for a couple of minutes in complete shock not knowing that she was pregnant and did not know what to do. [redacted] said she was very scared and ashamed of what had just happened and did not want to tell her parents. She panicked when she saw the baby was moving so she grabbed a towel and wrapped the placenta/baby fetus in a towel and hid it in her bedroom closet floor. After some time she went to sleep until the next morning and she went to work [redacted] to her mother [redacted] about the situation when she picked her up from work. [redacted] informed the grandmother [redacted] and that [redacted] called the non-emergency number. According to the statement, the baby fetus was still inside the sack/placenta and did not appear to have been tampered with, it appeared as a miscarriage delivery. Forensics arrived and processed the scene. The medical examiner will take jurisdiction of the deceased [redacted] for details are known.	Fetus demise.

There was another risk assessment completed and the mother was again advised to go into counseling. It is unknown if she sought services through an outside provider. He has not told anyone that he was going to harm himself or had suicidal ideation. He was not placed under a Baker Act as the only issue is that he was a very angry little boy.
